Welcome

Hello Biglife family,

I am excited to announce that once again our global network will be participating in 10 Days of Prayer beginning May 15th and culminating on Pentecost Sunday, May 24th.

While we have been blessed by the prayer guide that 10 Days of Prayer provides, based on very favorable input last year, we have again created a prayer guide that is specific to Biglife. Regional leaders in 10 areas have provided content that will direct us over the course of the 10 days.

As a reminder, here are the 4 core commitments that 10 Days of Prayer asks those who participate to adhere to:

1. Set apart 10 days.

This is a call to take a break from what is normal on earth to enter into what is normal in heaven for 10 days.

2. Devote yourself to prayer and worship with others.

As a decentralized network, this means gathering each day with those who are a part of your simple church. For those in areas where generational growth is happening, feel free to meet as a city or regional expression if the Spirit leads you to do that. However, there is no expectation of meeting beyond your simple church.

3. Fast from food in some way.

For those with health challenges that prevent fasting from food, consider fasting from certain types of food you would normally eat. For everyone else, you could consider eating just one meal a day, intermittently going 24 hours or more without food, eating only fruits and vegetables, or some combination of all of them, as the Spirit leads.

4. Fast from social media and entertainment.

The idea is to put aside the things that are not necessary to free up that time to spend with the Lord and with others. We do not consider 115.1 social media, so please continue to engage daily with the 115.1 app to share your experiences and to be encouraged by what others are sharing through their experience during the 10 days.

Our partnership with 10 Days of Prayer continues to be a great blessing to us at Biglife. These times of fasting and prayer are molding us more into the image of Jesus therefore making us healthier disciples. Now that we have participated in 10 Days several times, it would be easy to become complacent and to perhaps think of this time as an obligation rather than an incredible opportunity.

My encouragement to you is to begin asking the Lord what is one thing that you desire to see the Lord do? Perhaps it is a breakthrough for something on a personal level. Perhaps it is a breakthrough in the hearts of those you are trying to reach. What is one thing that you have been desiring and praying for? We see many examples throughout the Scriptures of supernatural things happening as people purposed themselves to fast and pray. I am believing we are going to see God do what only He can do during these 10 days!

Day 1—Africa

1.1 Billion People

“Remembering God’s faithfulness, seeking His face, and trusting His future.”

Africa consists of 56 nations/territories across 3,751 people groups and languages among which 989 are still unreached to this day. There are many reports of movements of God happening across the continent where millions are coming to faith and it is one of the fastest growing churches in the world. However, the need for discipleship is of most importance to see the continent transformed and mobilized to reach all of the remaining people groups. As we see indigenous leaders emerge across different regions, we pray that sustainable churches will emerge and turn their community’s upside down for Jesus.



Look Back - What God has done that is praiseworthy

“I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your miracles of long ago.” — Psalm 77:11

- Thank God for the spread of the Gospel across Africa and the growth of the Church. We are witnessing the multiplication of disciples and churches across the continent.
- Celebrate lives transformed, communities reached, and disciples made among unreached people groups and refugees.
- Remember God’s protection through seasons of hardship, conflict, and crisis, especially in South Sudan, the Congo, Sudan, the Sahel region, and Nigeria. Despite these challenges, God has strengthened the faith of believers and churches.
- Give thanks for God’s provision, enabling outreach to those affected by war and natural calamities, demonstrating Christ’s love and sharing His message.
- Honor and thank God for faithful leaders and local believers who labor in the harvest, sacrificially giving their time and lives for the Kingdom.

- For economic restoration, innovation, and opportunities that uplift believers and transform communities.
- For Africa to become a strong sending force, raising and sending disciples to the nations.
- For the emergence of churches across each region so that they can function as a mission hub to sustain the work of the ministry.

Day 2—South Asia

1.75 Billion People



The South Asia region faces numerous challenges in its mission to spread the Gospel. Some of the key hurdles include:

Persecution and Violence: Christians especially in India often face persecution, harassment, and violence from extremist groups and sometimes even authorities.

Cultural and Social Barriers: The dominant cultures and religions in South Asia can make it difficult for Christians to openly practice their faith or share it with others.

Government Restrictions: Some governments in the region impose restrictions on Christian gatherings, conversions, and evangelism, making it tough for churches to operate freely.

Spiritual Opposition: The church in South Asia often faces spiritual opposition from forces that seek to hinder the spread of the Gospel.



Look Back - What God has done that is praiseworthy

We look back and thank God for the thousands of people who have come to faith and are growing in their walk with God. As a result, thousands of new groups have started and we have been able to train new believers to become disciple makers.

We also praise God for opening doors for us to start work in 3 new leprosy colonies - where families have been saved and new groups have started. We are also thankful for all our outreach programs, trainings, and community services that have flourished and made a difference in the lives of the people we serve.

- Safety for believers and resources for ministry.
- Communities reflecting God's love and values.



Action Step - An act of obedience

Establish a prayer team to support your ministry that can provide encouragement, accountability, and collective prayer. This team can pray specifically for the needs of your ministry, your vision for the future, and the individuals involved.

Day 3—Central Asia

85 Million People



During these past seasons, many of our brothers and sisters from different people groups and communities around Central Asia faced various hardships caused by war, disasters, and instability. Even during these challenging times, God is using local believers to fulfill the spiritual and physical needs of His people. God has led us to places where His work is needed. In areas that are forgotten or hard to reach, God has used us to make a Kingdom impact.

In these moments, God has placed a deep love in our hearts for our brothers and sisters facing circumstances and those who have yet to hear the Gospel. He has placed compassion and eagerness to serve God's plan, and not our own. It is what He does through obedient and willing hearts, not what we can do on our own.

God has used His people to free His people from bondage. His Hand works through us when we deliver food bags to brothers and sisters affected by disasters. The Lord is our Shepherd—even when conflict surrounds. He guides His children to green pastures. God is using ordinary people to do these extraordinary things.



Look Back - What God has done that is praiseworthy

- We thank God for his provision and protection during instability and conflict. His work continues to increase even during times of uncertainty.
- When conflicts rise between nations, and borders and communication are cut-off, You make ways for the Gospel to move. Your Word provides peace and comfort. You arrange provisions for Your people in need. No obstacle can stand a chance against Your plan. We praise You Lord for being the Ultimate Provider.
- Thank you Lord for using us to provide food, medical care, shelter, and spiritual encouragement to our brothers and sisters in times of need.
- We praise You, Father, for the transformation You are bringing among our brothers and sisters in the brick kilns. You never forget your people. You have broken generational bondage and You have restored their dignity. You have raised disciples and leaders within the brick kilns who have dedicated their lives to Your work. You have blessed them through businesses. Above all, You are opening their eyes to the truth of Your Word and the eternal salvation found in Christ.
- Thank you Father, for raising brothers and sisters who know the cost of serving Jesus, but still remain steadfast.
- Thank you Lord, for all the brothers and sisters who support and pray for Your work around the world.
- We praise God for opening doors in countries all over Central Asia. We are eager to serve Your people in these new countries.
- Thank you Lord for providing methods and resources so that remote areas that were previously inaccessible can now receive Bibles, audio Bibles, and training.

Look Forward - What our leaders are praying to see happen

- We pray for expanded access to unreached communities. Many regions remain closed or difficult to reach. Leaders are asking God to open doors for the Gospel, provide opportunities to share His Word, and guide new fellowships in these areas.
- Pray for provision of essential resources. Bibles, audio resources, training materials, food, medical aid, and relief support are critical to sustain ministry, make disciples, and provide practical care for vulnerable communities.
- Pray for our leaders who continue to spread the Gospel and step into new countries. We ask God to go before them & open doors and hearts.
- We pray every city and community is reached. We pray for regular sharing, house churches, and the start of bible distribution in the new areas God is commanding us to serve.
- Ask God to embolden local believers to share the Gospel fearlessly. Pray that they would proclaim the Gospel without fear.
- We pray for provision of financial resources and materials such as Bibles, audio Bibles, Jesus Movie projectors, training materials, food, and medical supplies.

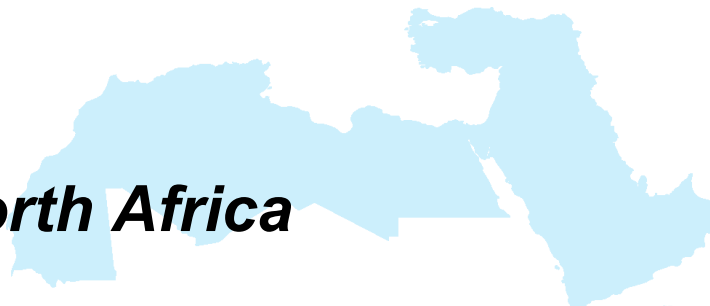


Action Step - An act of obedience

- Skip one meal and use that time to pray for the unreached, the persecuted, and for healing and comfort for the many families of those who have been martyred, especially the orphans.
- Commit to doing one small act of kindness like sharing a meal, a message, or helping someone in need, so that God's love is made visible.

Day 4—Middle East / North Africa

510 Million People



Biglife Ministry in the Middle East and North Africa (MENA), covers about 20 Arab countries. These countries in the region are especially hard to reach with the gospel. We work with more than 20 leaders in the countries listed below:

- Asia: Syria, the Holy Land, Lebanon, Jordan, and Yemen
- Semi-Arabian Peninsula: Qatar, UAE, Bahrain, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, and Iraq
- North-East Africa: Egypt, Sudan
- North Africa: Algeria, Morocco, Tunisia
- North-West Africa: Mauritania, Chad
- East Africa: South Sudan

Our work focuses mainly on disciple making and the creation of home groups in these countries. Recently, the main focus of our activities has been on reaching hard-to-reach people groups in: Mauritius, Algeria, Libya, and Chad.

We have many challenges which include: 1) The growing tensions and conflict in the region, especially involving Israel, the United States, Iran, and other countries, which brings fear and uncertainty to many people. 2) Difficult economic conditions affecting families in Jordan, Lebanon, and Syria. 3) Ongoing suffering from war, displacement, and poverty in several parts of the region. 4) Many believers must meet carefully and quietly because of social pressure and security concerns.



Look Back - What God has done that is praiseworthy

- Even during war and uncertainty, the Lord continues to bless the ministry. More Bibles are being distributed, and food support is reaching many brothers and families in the Arab region.
- In Syria, despite difficult security situations and occasional violence, we thank God for new house groups that started last month.
- We thank the Lord for the gift of love to people who are in need in South Sudan (persons affected by leprosy and refugees) and orphans in Jordan, Chad, and Egypt.
- We thank God for evangelistic trips to Tunisia, for new believers coming to the Lord, and for many “people of peace” in different areas.
- In Algeria, brothers used the month of Ramadan for evening outreach. We thank God for growing house groups, media ministry, and new baptisms.
- We also thank God for Morocco, for new believers, and for ministry continuing in several regions.
- We thank God for the work in Chad, South Sudan, and Jordan, where house group ministry continues to grow.

- In Jordan, believers meet in more than eight house groups during the week, even amidst sirens and explosions in nearby areas. The Lord continues to strengthen believers and fill them with joy.

“But he said, “I must preach the good news of the kingdom of God to the other towns also, because that is why I was sent.” Luke 4:43 NIV

We feel the Holy Spirit leading us to Tunisia, Morocco, and Algeria to take the gospel into new cities. We pray that the Lord will open these closed cities to his gospel.



Look Forward - What our leaders are praying to see happen

- Pray for peace and wisdom for leaders during the current tensions in the region.
- Pray for political stability and peace in Syria, where security incidents still happen from time to time.
- Pray for the women's ministry to be launched in the MENA region. For God to raise up women as leaders that will expand His work to the other 50% of our communities.
- Pray for protection and encouragement for believers and ministry leaders serving in sensitive areas.
- Pray for the people of Jordan, Syria, Lebanon, and the Gulf countries during these difficult times.
- Pray that the Lord will continue to open doors for the Gospel across the Middle East and North Africa.
- Pray that many more people of peace will be found and that new disciples and leaders will be raised up.
- Take time to pray regularly for peace and stability in the Middle East and North Africa.
- Pray for believers who continue to serve the Lord despite war, economic pressure, and insecurity.
- Ask God to strengthen house groups and raise up new leaders in the region.



Action Step - An act of obedience

Knowing that we use God's weapons to knock down strongholds (2 Cor. 10:4-5), one of our greatest weapons that God gives us is His Word. Memorize a scripture verse(s) to add to your arsenal as you battle strongholds in your own context.

Day 5—Oceania

50 Million People



The Oceania region stretches across nearly 9 million square kilometres—and right now, we are losing ground. Many of these island nations were reached with Christianity in the 1800s, but what remains today is largely a colonial legacy that is no longer influential. As Western culture and digital influence flood in, something vital is being stripped away—the strength of our cultural identity, family structure, and spiritual ownership.

Everywhere we go, we hear the same thing: the legacy church is fading. Not slowly—rapidly. Leaders see it. They feel it. And many do not know how to respond, but they seem hesitant to depart from the legacy model. Younger generations, especially young men, are disengaging, drifting, or walking away entirely. The methods that once worked are no longer reaching them.

We are up against two realities that cannot be ignored: the sheer vastness of the region, and a deeply ingrained church model that is no longer producing life. This is not a situation to observe—it's one that demands prayerful and kinetic action.



Look Back - What God has done that is praiseworthy

- Disciple making trainings in Suva which engaged approximately 20 people.
- Whilst the island nation of Samoa presented us with spiritual opposition, a Fijian Sister met a Samoan woman and was invited to Samoa to share the vision of disciple making.
- A connection through a conference allowed a leader in Biglife to travel to the Solomon Islands to train Edgar and a number of young men who are continuing to be obedient.



Look Up - What our region desires to grow in

“Through the work of the apostles, many God-signs were set up among the people, many wonderful things done. They all met regularly and in remarkable harmony on the Temple porch named after Solomon. But even though people admired them a lot, outsiders were wary about joining them. On the other hand, those who put their trust in the Master were added right and left, men and women both.” Acts 5:12-14 The Message

We are not aiming for incremental change—we are contending for a decisive shift. Our vision is to see people move immediately from belief to action—followers who obey without delay, without compromise, and without counting the cost. Disciples who raise the standard, not lower it. Men and women who don't just receive the message, but embody it— calling others to rise with them.

We see a different kind of movement emerging: a hardened, focused, company of spiritual warriors. Not tethered to comfort. Not dulled by tradition. Not distracted by the noise of modern

life. But awake, disciplined, and ready. Because the reality is this—hundreds of islands remain untouched, unengaged, and waiting.



Look Forward - What our leaders are praying to see happen

- Pray for the few who are obeying through the trainings in Fiji and Solomon Islands, that they would reach out to their close networks and the islands beyond.
- Pray for further recon within the island regions within Melanesia, Polynesia, Micronesia and Australasia to engage with persons of peace and establish “hubs” of obedience within these regions.



Action Step - An act of obedience

Set aside intentional time to engage with the Oceania region before God.

Begin by opening a map and slowly tracing the vast spread of islands—many you may never have heard of. Let the scale and isolation of these places sink in. As you do, ask the Holy Spirit to sharpen your awareness and give you His perspective for the region.

Pray deliberately. Listen carefully. Pay attention to impressions, scriptures, or specific burdens that comes to mind.

Don't rush this—lean in and allow space for God to speak. Write down what you sense He is revealing. These insights matter, and they are meant to be shared and discerned together.

If you feel stirred to continue standing in prayer for Oceania beyond these 10 days, take a step further—let Biglife know. There is a place for you in this, and we want to equip you to remain engaged for the long haul.

Day 6—Southeast/East Asia

2.3 Billion People

This region has a combined population of **2.3 billion people**- this is almost 1/3 of the world's total population. **92%** (2.1 billion people) are unreached or not Christians.

A sub-segment of the unreached within the countries we work in, is the Buddhist frontier people cluster, where they practice Buddhism and/or animism (the worship of spirits). The Buddhist world is one of the last major frontiers for the Gospel. In most Buddhist majority countries and communities, they have less than 1-2% evangelical Christians. The Buddhist world has been largely resistant to the Gospel, but the good news is that they are receptive to a relational Gospel.



Look Back - What God has done that is praiseworthy

All these things are direct answers to prayer from last year's 10 Days!

- In Myanmar: earthquake relief efforts have created new opportunities for first-generation disciples to emerge and for house fellowships to begin forming among a previously unreached people group.
- In Thailand: we have seen a number of new believers, new disciples, and new house fellowships start among the majority Thai people group (only 0.3% Evangelical Christians) in several unreached areas. This is a direct answer to prayer from last year!
- In Laos: the Gospel has spread from 10 villages to 40 villages.



Look Up - What our region desires to grow in

Look Forward - What our leaders are praying to see happen

- In East Asia: that movements would continue to take root, multiply, and mature in all the seven major regions.
- In Thailand and Myanmar: that we would see 100 new house fellowships in each of these countries.
- In Laos: that we would see a multiplication of disciples and groups to many new villages.
- In Japan: where an Asian family has just moved, that God would open doors for many new persons of peace, new disciples, and new groups.
- In the Philippines: where people from 7 different mountain tribes were just trained, that they will be able to implement and see disciples and groups multiply within their tribes.



Action Step - An act of obedience

Commit to become a prayer multiplier. Go to our facebook private prayer group called “Prayer Partners for SEA & EA” and request to join the group. Then cast vision for 3 other people to pray and invite them to join the prayer group as well. Encourage them to do the same with 3 others.

Day 7—Latin America

670 Million People



Latin America (LATAM) covers a large geographical area, Mexico, Central America, South America, and The Caribbean. This vast area gives it a beautiful tapestry of so many people groups, hundreds of languages, and deep cultures. In this immense region we have seen God raising up work in several areas, but especially in South America. We have a solid team there who are building up local disciples and next generation leaders. Central America is getting started, but the work there is still young. Mexico has some scattered work and some setbacks, but we believe God will establish a solid team there as well. The Caribbean has some work in Cuba, along with new work getting started through the Special Ops initiative.

There are several challenges presented here, from the deeply rooted works-based thinking of the Roman Catholic tradition that followed many directly into Christian churches. This hierarchical system places a major obstacle in the Church, both culturally and religiously at times. It tends to want to centralize the church on one person or on one location. Lastly, the deep darkness of past native empires such as the Aztec, Maya, Inca, and the heavy Voodoo influence in the Caribbean, Brazil and some other central and South American countries.



Look Back - What God has done that is praiseworthy

- Peru: Recently started children's outreach and have been to share with their parents. Also, there are new disciples and upcoming trainings.
- Columbia: Second and third generations of disciples among the Wayuu indigenous people, and in the city of Maicao. Also, trainings are scheduled across Colombia in Bogotá, Medellín, Barranquilla, Bucaramanga, and Cartagena.
- Mexico: Báez Sánchez family as Christ continues to use them to make disciples in the Altos de Jalisco region of Mexico and to the ends of the earth.
- Costa Rica: "Los del Camino" a first of its kind Spanish-language podcast focused on disciple-making movements, simple church, and the nature of the church.
- Ecuador: Three local house gatherings in Loja, and one in Catamayo.
- Paraguay: New simple gatherings and opportunities to the nations.
- Brazil: God's Kingdom is advancing in several new areas.



Look Up - What our region desires to grow in

Discernment for a Regional Team (LATAM): Pray for wisdom, unity, and confirmation for a team sensing a call to confront spiritual strongholds across Latin America. Ephesians 6:10-13

Wisdom for Multiplication & Training: Pray for discernment in where and in whom to invest as interest in disciple-making training increases. Matthew 13:16-23



Look Forward - What our leaders are praying to see happen

All of Latin America:

- Pray for the ongoing translation of a key book on the Ephesians 4:11 gifts and their role in equipping the church for ministry and maturity in Christ.
- Pray for more laborers and against the spiritual warfare that our family faces.
- Pray for new leaders and simple gatherings.

Peru: Pray for the Peru team, which has been going through very difficult times and also pray for new home gatherings.

Columbia: Pray for leaders in rural and indigenous areas of Colombia who face danger from armed paramilitary groups and opposition from local religious authorities. Ask for protection, boldness, and continued Kingdom growth despite strong resistance.

Mexico: Pray for the mission field known as the "Circle of Silence" in The Altos de Jalisco, and for the current situation in Mexico, specifically regarding the violence perpetrated by cartels.

Costa Rica: Pray for political stability and that insecurity may decrease due to drug trafficking.

Ecuador: Ask God for strong leaders who have a deep identity as disciple-makers and Christ followers. Pray for a paradigm shift from centralized to decentralized, to overcome the strong traditional mindsets shaped by a Roman Catholic view of church.

Paraguay: Pray for Omar and his family to know and understand God's will for their family as they seek to extend the Kingdom throughout Argentina, Paraguay, Uruguay, Bolivia, and Chile.

Brazil: For the advancement of the Kingdom into new places.



Action Step - An act of obedience

Grab a map or your phone and commit to praying for the 5 "Opens" (heavens, hearts, homes, highways, and hands) over these remaining special ops locations in Latin America, so that God's Kingdom may come on earth as it is in heaven.

Anguilla, Antigua & Barbuda, Aruba, Bermuda, British Virgin Islands, Cayman Islands, Dominica, Equatorial Guinea, Grenada, Guadeloupe, Guyana, Martinique, Montserrat, Saint Bartheley, Saint Kitts & Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Martin, Suriname, and the U.S. Virgin Islands

Day 8—Europe

750 Million People



Europe has a history of Christian presence dating back to the Apostle Paul's travelling to Macedonia (modern day Greece). There are over 200 indigenous languages with many more arriving due to significant immigration. In 1900, nearly 95% identified as Christian, but this number fell to about 75% by the year 2000. Many who identify as Christian do so as a religious label, rather than having an active faith in Jesus. Disciple Making Movements (DMMs) are in their infancy in Europe today.

Biglife has been present in Europe since 2019, seeking to apply the biblical principles of disciple making. Much of this focus has been upon the existing church, where we are seeing an openness among some to fresh thinking. Mobilising the existing believers as disciple-makers is a key strategic emphasis. There have been barriers along the way from a resistance to change within the church, and often a negative view of the church from those outside.



Look Back - What God has done that is praiseworthy

- Expansion of the ministry in the UK with new people catching the vision for disciple making and being trained.
- New opportunities in Germany with the appointment of a national leader to spearhead the work, and encouraging early signs of engagement.
- Building a team of leaders who can train, equip, and support others in disciple making.

The word of God calls for the early believers and for us to persevere in pursuing his will. There are challenges and setbacks along the way, but we are called to fix our eyes upon Jesus and to draw strength from him.



Look Forward - What our leaders are praying to see happen

- Pray for the growing team of leaders to continue to trust in the Lord and be led by him in identifying and supporting others as disciple makers.
- Pray for fruit in the harvest in seeing people come to faith in Jesus across Europe.

- Pray for more open doors to share the vision, equip, and encourage people in disciple making in new communities and places.
- Pray for the beginnings of the ministry in Germany, Austria, Türkiye, and Slovenia, and for disciple making principles to take root and flourish there.
- Pray for a growing commitment to pray and seek the Lord.

Day 9—Caucasus & Eastern Europe

20 Million People

We work in countries such as Armenia, Russia, Georgia, Belarus, Baltic states and Moldova. The cultures, worldviews, traditions, languages, and religions in all these countries are varied. However, one thing that connects them all is that they used to be part of one country, the USSR, and that fact helps us to do missions in those countries. We are connecting and working with churches and Christian organisations. As well as, we also organize different events to reach unbelievers and people from other religions.

Our steps are: to find key people (people of peace), establish relationships with them, disciple them, and help them to make disciples among others. At different places/regions we face different challenges, such as confrontations with local/state authorities, religious leaders, and well-organised churches, or cultural discrepancies.
